SGRC UAV Assists Lowndes County in Aftermath of EF-2 Tornado

With a path over 200 yards wide, 6.2 miles long and with peak winds reaching 120 mph, a powerful tornado devastated Lowndes County residents on Sunday, February 4th. The tornado touched down just east of Dasher and then moved north-northwest, finally lifting off the ground east of Valdosta and north of Highway 84. The tornado caused damage to trees, powerlines, homes, and outbuildings.

In the following days SGRC-GIS staff dispatched the UAV (unmanned aerial vehicle/drone) team to the debris path and collected photographic details of damaged structures, destruction of timber, and other areas of damage directly caused by the tornado. The images collected were requested by Lowndes Emergency Management Agency (EMA) and the National Weather Service in Tallahassee. In addition, the SGRC created a story map of the event.



Transit-Oriented Development Guide for Urban and Rural Communities

Transportation Planning staff are currently in the initial phases of crafting a guide for Transit-Oriented Development tailored to both urban and rural settings. Transit-oriented development is a form of transit-centric urban planning that aims to cultivate lively, sustainable, and equitable neighborhoods by establishing compact, pedestrian-friendly areas close to public transportation hubs. These developments encompass a blend of commercial, residential, office, and recreational amenities.

This guide will offer a comprehensive examination of how transit-oriented development can be applied in both urban and rural areas of the Southern Georgia Region based on the makeup of the existing rural and urban transit systems that are in place. Implementing transit-oriented development yields a variety of public benefits, which can be seen on the graphic below.
