One Georgia Grants Awarded

The SGRC recently assisted the **City of Alma** and the **Brantley County Development Authority** (BCDA) in securing OneGeorgia Equity Grant funds.

The City of Alma was awarded \$2,498,218 to promote the Governor's Rural Workforce Housing Initiative. Funds awarded will used for infrastructure to serve the 40-acre Teresa's Estate Subdivision. The project will construct water, sewer and street improvements to serve 24 new housing units within the subdivision. The project will also enable the construction of 36 more homes in phase two of the development.

Announced in the Governor's 2023 State of the State Address, the Rural Workforce Housing Initiative is helping to spur the development of critically needed workforce housing in communities across the state.



Brantley County Development Authority (BCDA) was awarded \$500,000 for capacity building activities within the new Satilla Industrial Park. The project will provide street and drainage infrastructure improvements to the Park's 102.98 acres. The capacity building improvements will provide the essential infrastructure that is needed for successful industrial recruitment and job creation in Brantley County and the surrounding area.

The OneGeorgia Equity Fund provides financial assistance to rural communities to help build the necessary infrastructure for economic development. Equity funds are also available as loans for several different types of projects, such as constructing speculative buildings in order to attract additional industries to the region.

SGRC SBA 504 Loan Program Assists Bree's Daycare

The SGRC SBA 504 Loan Program recently assisted Bree and Travis Carter of **Bree's Creative Learning Childcare Center (BCLCC)** with the financing of a new 15,000 square foot building which will provide 24 hour/7 day a week childcare and early learning activities to up to 200 children per day and 50 at night. The expansion is designed to accommodate more working families that have nontraditional weekend and overnight working hours.

Bree's Creative Learning Childcare Center (BCLCC) is a locally owned State Licensed childcare and preschool operated by Bree Carter and Travis Carter. The center currently serves up to 120 children per day in its childcare center and an additional 50 students per day in its preschool program.

The Southern Georgia Area Development Corporation's assistance was in partnership with Southwest Georgia Bank of Valdosta for the financing of the loan. Southwest Georgia Bank provided 50% of the loan while SBA provided 40%. The borrowers injected 10%. Total financing for the loan was \$2,365,000.

Geographic Information Services (GIS)

2024 Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)

Prepare now for the 2024 Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)! The U.S. Census Bureau conducts the Boundary and Annexation Survey annually to collect information about selected legally defined geographic areas. The BAS provides state and local governments an opportunity to review the Census Bureau's legal boundary data to ensure the Census Bureau has the correct boundary, name and status information. Maintaining correct boundaries helps ensure that the Census Bureau assigs the appropriate housing and population counts to each government.

Be on the lookout for documents from the Census Bureau regarding the 2024 Boundary and Annexation Survey. A response from each of our local governments is required.



Why participate?

The federal government allocates more than \$2.3 trillion in federal funds annually for health, welfare, infrastructure, education, and other federal programs and services. **Maintaining correct bounda-ries helps ensure that the Census Bureau assigns the appropriate housing and popula-tion counts to each government so that governments receive funds appropriately**.

The Southern Georgia Regional Commission GIS Department can assist your community through and and/or all parts of the BAS process. Local Governments may even request that the SGRC GIS submit the digital annexation/de-annexation changes to the Census Bureau. Important Dates

- January 1, 2024 Boundary updates must be legally in effect on or before this date to be reported in the 2023 BAS.
- March 1, 2024 Boundary updates submitted by this date will be reflected in the ACS and PEP data estimates and in next year's BAS materials.
- May 31, 2024 Boundary updates submitted by this date will be reflected in next year's BAS materials.
