WHEREAS, the SGRC contracts with the Georgia Department of Transportation and the Georgia Department of Human Services to carryout transportation planning and Coordinated Human Service Transportation services throughout the region; and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Transportation has developed a Unified Certification Program for DBE certification and utilization; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Georgia Regional Commission, is a recipient of federal-aid funds for transportation planning and Coordinated Human Services Transportation purposes and pursuant to 49 CFR Part 26 this DBE Program Policy is intended to assist the SGRC in the administration and award of contract in order to provide disadvantaged businesses an opportunity to participate in SGRC transportation contracts in a non-discriminatory manner; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the SGRC that DBEs shall have the equal opportunity to participate in the performance of the SGRC's transportation contracts; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Southern Georgia Regional Commission Council adopts a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program Policy pursuant to 49 CFR Part 26.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program

What is a DBE?

A DBE is a for-profit small business concern that is at least 51 percent owned by one or more individuals who are both socially and economically disadvantaged. In the case of a corporation, 51 percent of the stock is owned by one or more such individuals; and, whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more of the socially and economically disadvantaged individuals who own it. Agencies, like the Southern Georgia Regional Commission (SGRC) uses programs for Disadvantaged Business Enterprises or DBEs to increase the participation by firms owned by disadvantaged individuals in all federal aid and state transportation funded contracts. In some cases, DBEs are further defined as enterprises owned by Women and/or Minorities as WBEs or MBEs, respectively.

Policy Statement

The SGRC has established a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program in accordance with regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), 49 CFR Part 26. SGRC has received Federal financial assistance from the Department of Transportation, and as a condition of receiving this assistance, SGRC has signed an assurance that it will comply with 49 CFR Part 26.

It is the policy of SGRC to ensure that DBEs, as defined in 49 CFR Part 26, have an equal opportunity to receive and participate in DOT-assisted contracts. It is also our policy:

- 1. To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT assisted contracts:
- 2. To create an environment in which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT assisted contracts;
- To ensure that the DBE Program is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law;
- 4. To ensure that only firms that fully meet 49 CFR Part 26 eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs;
- 5. To help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT assisted contracts;
- 6. To assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the market place outside the DBE Program.

The SGRC MPO Coordinator, has been delegated as the DBE Liaison Officer. In that capacity, the MPO Coordinator, is responsible for implementing all aspects of the DBE program. Implementation of the DBE program is accorded the same priority as compliance with all other legal obligations incurred by SGRC in its financial assistance agreements with the Department of Transportation.

SGRC has disseminated this policy statement to the SGRC Council, the Valdosta-Lowndes Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Committee and all of the US DOT funded components of our organization. This statement will be distributed to DBE and non-DBE business communities that perform work for SGRC on DOT assisted contracts. This policy will be made available upon request, at no charge, to any person making a verbal or written request. This policy will also be included in all request for services and procurement documentation, as well as, all contracts related to DOT assisted contracts.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

I. Objectives

It is the policy of SGRC to ensure that DBEs, as defined in 49 CFR Part 26, have an equal opportunity to receive and participate in DOT assisted contracts. It is also our policy:

- To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT assisted contracts:
- To create an environment in which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT assisted contracts:
- 3. To ensure that the DBE Program is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law:
- 4. To ensure that only firms that fully meet 49 CFR Part 26 eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs;
- 5. To help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT assisted contracts;
- 6. To assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the market place outside the DBE Program.

II. Applicability

SGRC is the recipient of federal funds from the US DOT authorized by US Code: Title 23.1.134 & 135; Title 49.53.5303, 5304, 5307, 5310 and other programs.

III. Non-discrimination Requirements

SGRC will never exclude any person from participation in, deny any person the benefits of, or otherwise discriminate against anyone in connection with the award and performance of any contract covered by 49 CFR part 26 on the basis of race, color, sex, or national origin.

In administering its DBE program, SGRC will not, directly, through contractual or other arrangements, use criteria or methods of administration that have the effect of defeating or substantially impairing accomplishment of the objectives of the DBE program with respect to individuals of a particular race, color, sex, or national origin.

IV. Record Keeping Requirements

a. Reporting

In order to monitor the progress of its DBE program, SGRC will develop and maintain a record keeping system which will identify and assess DBE contract awards, progress in achieving DBE subcontract goals, and other DBE affirmative action efforts. Specifically, SGRC will maintain records (for a period of five years) showing:

- 1. Procedures followed by SGRC as set forth in this program, to identify and assess DBE contract awards and progress in achieving prescribed goals;
- 2. Specific efforts to identify and award contracts to DBEs;
- 3. Amount paid to each DBE subcontractor by a contractor and reported to the contracting agency on a quarterly basis; and
- 4. These reports shall include as a minimum:
 - a. The number of contracts awarded to DBEs;
 - b. A description of the general categories of contracts awarded to DBEs;
 - c. The dollar value of contracts awarded to DBEs;
 - d. The percentage of the dollar value of all contracts awarded to DBEs; and
 - e. An indication of whether and the extent of which the percentage met or exceeded the goal specified in the application.
- 5. The SGRC will submit these reports to the respective state agency (Georgia Department of Transportation or Georgia Department of Human Services) for each respective program.

The records and reports required shall provide information relating to firms owned and controlled by minorities separately from information relating to firms owned and controlled by women.

Records shall be available upon request of an authorized officer or employee of the government. SGRC shall submit reports conforming in frequency and format to existing contract reporting requirements of the applicable departmental element. Where no such contract reporting requirement exists, DBE reports shall be submitted annually.

SGRC will create a bidders list, consisting of information about all DBE and non-DBE firms that bid or quote on DOT assisted contracts. The purpose of this requirement is to allow use of the bidder list approach to calculating overall goals. The list shall also include the following information: Firm name, Firm address, Firm's status as a DBE or non-DBE; age of firm, average annual gross receipts.

V. Federal Financial Assistance Agreement

The SGRC has signed the following assurances, applicable to all DOT assisted contracts and their administration:

- 1. SGRC shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of any DOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE Program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The recipient shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT assisted contracts. The recipient's DBE Program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by DOT, is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Implementation of this program is a legal obligation and failure to carry out its terms shall be treated as a violation of this agreement. Upon notification to SGRC of its failure to carry out its approved program, the Department may impose sanction as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C. 3801 et seq.).
- 2. The contractor, sub-recipient, or subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR part 26 in the award and administration of DOT assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate.
- 3. The prime contractor agrees to pay each subcontractor under this prime contract for satisfactory performance of its contract no later than 15 days from the receipt of each payment the prime contract receives from SGRC. The prime contractor agrees further to return retainage payments to each subcontractor within 15 days after the subcontractors work is satisfactorily completed. Any delay or postponement of payment from the above referenced time frame may occur only for good cause following written approval of SGRC. This clause applies to both DBE and non-DBE subcontracts.

This language will appear in financial assistance agreements with sub-recipients.

ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

VI. DBE Program Updates

Since SGRC has received a grant of \$250,000 or more in FTA planning capital, and or operating assistance in a federal fiscal year, we will continue to carry out this program until all funds from DOT financial assistance have been expended. We will provide to DOT updates representing significant changes in the program.

VII. DBE Liaison Officer (DBELO)

In that capacity, the DBELO is responsible for implementing all aspects of the DBE program and ensuring that SGRC complies with all provision of 49 CFR Part 26. The DBELO has direct, independent access to the Executive Director, concerning DBE program matters. An organization chart displaying the DBELO's position in the organization is found as Attachment Two.

The DBELO is responsible for developing, implementing and monitoring the DBE program, in coordination with other appropriate officials. The DBELO has a staff of one to assist in the administration of the program. The duties and responsibilities include the following:

- 1. Gathers and reports statistical data and other information as required by DOT.
- 2. Reviews third party contracts and purchase requisitions for compliance with this program.
- 3. Works with all departments to set overall annual goals.
- 4. Ensures that bid notices and requests for proposals are available to DBEs in a timely manner.
- 5. Identifies contracts and procurements so that DBE goals are included in solicitations (both race-neutral methods and contract specific goals attainment and identifies ways to improve progress.
- 6. Analyzes SGRC's progress toward attainment and identifies ways to improve progress.
- 7. Participates in pre-bid meetings when necessary.
- 8. Advises the governing body on DBE matters and achievement.
- 9. Provides DBEs with information and assistance in preparing bids, obtaining bonding and insurance.
- 10. Plans and participates in DBE training seminars.
- 11. Certifies DBEs according to the criteria set by DOT and acts as liaison to the Uniform Certification Process in Georgia.
- 12. Provides outreach to DBEs and community organizations to advise them of opportunities.
- 13. Maintains SGRC's directory of DBEs.

VIII. DBE Financial Institutions

The SGRC periodically solicits competitively for banking services. The SGRC will ensure that financial institutions that are determined to be owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals in the community are encouraged to respond to the solicitation and to present the range of services that they offer.

IX. Directory

The State of Georgia Uniform Certification Program (UCP) is operational, and the SGRC will participate in the combined directory. The Georgia Department of Transportation maintains this UCP. The process for firms to become certified is available through the Georgia Department of Transportation. The UCP lists the firm's name, address, phone number, most recent certification, and the type of work for which the firm wishes to be considered. The directory is updated periodically, and is made available to contractors and the public. The UCP will be the primary source for the SGRC to seek DBE firms.

X. Overconcentration

Pursuant to 49 CFR Part 26.33, if SGRC (and/or its subrecipients) determine that DBE firms are so over-concentrated in one or more types of work as to unduly burden the opportunity of non-DBE firms to participate in that type of work, it will devise appropriate measures to address this over-concentration. These measures may include:

- 1. Technical assistance:
- 2. Business development; and
- 3. Any other measures to assist DBEs in performing in other types of work.

To date, SGRC has not identified that over-concentration exists in the types of work that DBEs perform.

XI. Business Development Programs

The SGRC has elected not to establish a DBE business development program to assist firms in gaining the ability to compete successfully in the marketplace outside the DBE program. The SGRC will refer DBE firms to other business development programs available locally and statewide.

XII. Monitoring and Enforcement Mechanisms

SGRC will take the following monitoring and enforcement mechanisms to ensure compliance with 49 CFR Part 26.

- We will bring to the attention of the Department of Transportation any false, fraudulent, or dishonest conduct in connection with the program, so that DOT can take the steps (e.g., referral to the Department of Justice for criminal prosecution, referral to the DOT Inspector General, action under suspension and debarment or Program Fraud and Civil Penalties rules) provided in 26.109.
- 2. We will consider similar action under our own legal authorities, including responsibility determinations in future contracts.
- 3. We will also provide a monitoring and enforcement mechanism to verify that work committed to DBEs at contract award is actually performed by the DBEs. This will be accomplished by in-the-field inspections and monitoring.
- 4. We will keep a running tally of actual payments to DBE firms for work committed to them at the time of contract award.

GOALS, GOOD FAITH EFFORTS, AND COUNTING

XIII. Set-asides or Quotas

SGRC does not use set-asides or quotas in any way in the administration of this DBE program or DOT assisted contracts.

XIV. Overall Goals

The purpose of the overall goal is to achieve a "level playing field" for ready, willing, and able Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) seeking to participate in SGRC's DOT assisted contracts. In an effort to reach this level playing field, SGRC examined its programs and relevant local markets, then determined the amount of participation DBEs would be expected to achieve in the absence of present and past effects of discrimination. 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 26.45 requires recipients of USDOT federal aid to utilize a two step process in the development of their Overall DBE Goals:

Step One: Calculate relative availability of DBE certified or non-certified firms ready, willing, and able to work on US DOT assisted contract and/or agreements. This base figure is derived by dividing a number representing DBE's eligible to work on DOT assisted contracts by a number representing all firms eligible to work on DOT assisted contracts.

Step Two: Adjust calculation to account for other evidence. (Once recipient has base figure resulting from Step One calculation, recipient must seek more data, with which to adjust base figure up or down.)

In accordance with Section 26.45(f) the SGRC will submit its overall goal to the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) and the Georgia Department of Human Services (GDHS) by August 1 of each year.

The SGRC will publish a notice of the proposed overall goals, informing the public that the proposed goal and its rationale are available for inspection during normal business hours at our principal office for 30 days following the date of the notice, and informing the public that the SGRC will accept comments on the goals for 45 days from the date of the notice. Notice will be published in the legal organs with the four largest circulations, and the website of SGRC: www.sgrc.us. Normally, we will issue this notice by June 1 of each year. The notice will include addresses to which comments may be sent and addresses (including offices and websites) where the proposal may be reviewed.

SGRC's overall goal submission to GDOT and GDHS will include a summary of information and comments received during this public participation process and our responses.

A summary of the Overall Goal process can be found in Attachment Three.

SGRC will begin using our overall goal on July 1 of each year, unless the SGRC has received other instructions from GDOT and GDHS. If the SGRC establishes a goal on a project basis, we will begin using our goal by the time of the first solicitation for a DOT assisted contract for the project.

XV. Transit Vehicle Manufacturers Goals

SGRC does not procure vehicles directly from manufacturers and therefore will not have a Transit Vehicle Manufacturer Goal.

XVI. Breakout of Estimated Race-Neutral & Race-Conscious Participation

The SGRC will meet the maximum feasible portion of its overall goal by using race-neutral means of facilitating DBE participation. The SGRC uses the following race-neutral means to increase DBE participation:

- Arranging solicitations, times for the presentation of bids/offerers, quantities, specifications and delivery schedules in ways that facilitate DBE, and other small business, participation. For example, where practical the SGRC could unbundle large contracts to make them more accessible to small businesses and could encourage prime contractors to do subcontract portions of work that they might otherwise perform with their own forces;
- 2. Providing technical assistance and other services;
- 3. Ensuring that information concerning bid/offer opportunities is available to DBE's and other small businesses. For example, ensuring the inclusion of DBE's, and other small businesses, on recipient mailing lists for bidders/offerers; and
- 4. Ensuring awareness of our DBE directory though print and electronic means.

XVII. Contract Goals

The SGRC will use contract goals to meet any portion of the overall goal. SGRC anticipates being able to meet using race-neutral means. Contract goals are established so that, over the period to which the overall goal applies, they will cumulatively result in meeting any portion of our overall goal that is not projected to be met through the use of race-neutral means.

The SGRC will establish contract goals only on those DOT assisted contracts that have subcontracting possibilities. The SGRC need not establish a contract goal on every such contract, and the size of contract goals will be adapted to the circumstances of each such contract (e.g., type and location of work, availability of DBEs to perform the particular type of work.). The SGRC will advertise prime contracts to DBEs and non-DBEs.

The SGRC will express our contract goals as a percentage of the Federal share amount of the DOT assisted contract.

XVIII. Good Faith Efforts

The obligation of the bidder/offeror is to make good faith efforts. The bidder/offerer (to match the spelling of offerer used above) can demonstrate that it has done so either by meeting the contract goal or documenting good faith efforts. Examples of good faith efforts are found in Appendix A to Part 26. The SGRC will ensure that all information is complete and accurate and adequately documents the bidder/offer's good faith efforts before committing to the performance of the contract by the bidder/offerer.

The SGRC treats bidder/offers' compliance with good faith efforts' requirements as a matter of responsibility. Each solicitation for which a contract goal has been established will require the bidders/offerers to submit the following information:

- 1. The names and addresses of DBE firms that will participate in the contract;
- 2. A description of the work that each DBE will perform;
- 3. The dollar amount of the participation of each DBE firm participating;
- 4. Written and signed documentation of commitment to use a DBE subcontractor whose participation it submits to meet a contract goal;
- 5. Written and signed confirmation from the DBE that it is participating in the contract as provided in the prime contractors commitment and
- 6. If the contract goal is not met, evidence of good faith efforts.

Within 30 days of being informed by SGRC that it is not responsible because it has not documented sufficient good faith efforts, a bidder/offerer may request administrative reconsideration. Bidder/offerers should make this request in writing to the following reconsideration official: Executive Director, 327 W Savannah Ave., Valdosta, GA 31602. The reconsideration official will not have played any role in the original determination that the bidder/offerer did not document sufficient good faith efforts.

As part of this reconsideration, the bidder/offerer will have the opportunity to provide written documentation or argument concerning the issue of whether it met the goal or made adequate good faith efforts to do so. The bidder/offerer will have the opportunity to meet in person with the SGRC's reconsideration official to discuss the issue of whether it met the goal or made adequate good faith efforts to do. The SGRC will send the bidder/offerer a written decision on reconsideration, explaining the basis for finding that the bidder did or did not meet the goal or make adequate good faith efforts to do so. The result of the reconsideration process is not administratively appealable to the Department of Transportation.

The SGRC will require a contractor to make good faith efforts to replace a DBE that is terminated or has otherwise failed to complete its work on a contract with another certified DBE, to the extent needed to meet the contract goal. The SGRC will require the prime contractor to notify the Project Manager and the DBE Liaison Officer immediately of the DBE's inability or unwillingness to perform and provide reasonable documentation.

In this situation, the SGRC will require the prime contractor to obtain our prior approval of the substitute DBE and to provide copies of new or amended subcontracts, or documentation of good faith efforts. If the contractor fails or refuses to comply in the time specified, our contracting office will issue an order stopping all or part of work and/or payment until satisfactory action has been taken. If the contractor still fails to comply, the contracting officer may issue a termination for default proceeding.

XIX. Counting DBE Participation

The SGRC will count DBE participation toward overall and contract goals as provided in 49 CFR 26.55.

CERTIFICATION STANDARDS

XX. Certification Process

The SGRC will rely primarily on the statewide Unified Certification Process, and its policy for accepting certifications issued by other US DOT recipients under 49 CFR Part 26. The UCP will use the certification standards of Subpart D of Part 26 and the certification procedures of Subpart E of Part 26 to determine the eligibility of firms to participate as DBEs in DOT assisted contracts.

The SGRC has not certified any DBEs. All future certifications and recertifications will be done through the UCP.

For information about the certification process or to apply for certification, firms should contact the DBE Liaison Officer, 327 W Savannah Ave, Valdosta, GA 31602.

To remove a DBE's certification, the SGRC will rely on the Unified Certification Program procedures consistent with §26.87.

The SGRC will safeguard from disclosure to third parties information that may reasonably be regarded as confidential business information, consistent with Federal, state, and local law. Notwithstanding any contrary provisions of state or local law, the SGRC will not release personal financial information submitted in response to the personal net worth requirement to a third party (other than DOT) without the written consent of the submitter.

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

The Southern Georgia Regional Commission's (SGRC) overall goal for FY2019-2021 is the following: **74.0%** of the Federal Financial assistance we will expend in Department of Transportation assisted contracts, exclusive of FTA funds to be used for the purchase of transit vehicles.

Methodology used to Calculate Overall Goal

Step 1:


Determine the base figure for the relative availability of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs). The base figure for the relative availability of DBE's was calculated as follows:

The data source or demonstrable evidence used to derive the numerator was: Firms capable of supporting Urban Transportation Planning, Transit Planning and Transit Operations in the State of Georgia. The data source was the listing of pre-qualified contractors from the Georgia Department of Transportation for classes: 1.02, 1.04, 2.02, and 2.08; and the Uniform Certification Program (UCP) listing of DBEs for the State of Georgia for NAICS codes: 485113, 485111, 485991, 541614, and 54133. Data was accessed on 4/25/18. One additional DBE was added for the Transit Operators as the current provider is not certified, but is able to be certified.

No DBE firms or an insufficient number of firms were located in the SGRC service area. Therefore the SGRC used the entire state of Georgia as its area to gather DBE firms from using the above listed resources.


When we divided the numerator by the denominator we arrived at the base figure for our overall goal and that number was **264%**.



Step 2:

After calculating a base figure of the relative availability of DBEs, evidence was examined to determine what adjustment was needed to the base figure in order to arrive at the overall goal.

In order to reflect as accurately as possible the DBE participation we would expect to garner, we have adjusted our base figure to **74.0%**.



The data used to determine the adjustment to the base figure was the percentage of funds that are anticipated to be bid to contractors over the forthcoming three years.

The reason we chose to adjust our figure using this data was because the base figure was greater than 100%.

PUBLIC NOTICE Southern Georgia Regional Commission (SGRC) DBE PROGRAM GOALS Fiscal Year July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. Georgia Department of Human Services, Georgia Department of Transportation and SGRC announces its proposed Fiscal Year goal of 74.0% for transportation oriented Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation.
