Agenda Item #1 – Call to Order

Mr. Milligan called the meeting to order at 3:00 PM.

Agenda Item #2 – Introductions/Roll Call

A. Review Committee Attendance (all committees)

Mr. Milligan stated that the roll would be called for those present. Mr. Hull went through the committee member roster to verify whether or not a member was present.

Agenda Item #3 – Approval of Regular Meeting Minutes

Mr. Skrine asked the committee members to review the December 1, 2020 meeting minutes. Mr. Milligan made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. McLane made a motion in the second. The minutes were approved by all members with the exception of Jim Galloway and another individual (who could not be determined), who both stated that they were absent from this meeting; the motion carried.

Agenda Item #4- New Business

A. (PC) Nominating Committee Does Not Apply to the CAC.

B. FY2021 Unified Planning Work Program Amendment Resolution FY21-4 Action: Recommendation/Adopt

Mr. Hull notified the committee that the FY2021 UPWP was being amended due to additional funding received from GDOT in the amount of two dollars. He stated that those changes will be reflected in the contract. He continued in order to update the funding amounts an amendment must be completed with a motion and vote from the CAC to recommend it to the policy committee. Ms. Flucas made a motion to recommend the UPWP for approval, Mr. Wisenbaker made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

C. FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program Adoption Resolution FY21-5 Ms. Martin notified the committee that the FY2022 UPWP had been completed and that staff did not receive any major comments from our planning partners. Ms. Martin reviewed the UPWP Budget Summary to the committee and explained that in order for the UPWP to be adopted that there needs to be a motion and a vote for the document to be recommended to the TAC. Mr. Branham made a motion to recommend the document be approved and moved forward to the TAC. Mr. Galloway made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

D. Participation Plan Update Adoption Resolution FY21-6

Mr. Hull notified the committee that the Public Participation Plan had been out for public comment for the last 45 days. He continued that the comments that were received were minor and did not change the content of the document. He stated that one comment did not really impact the document but was a request from Mr. Branham, a member on the CAC, to allow for the chair of the CAC to have a voting seat on the Policy Committee (PC). Mr. Hull gave some background on how the CAC chair previously had a seat in the PC but it was years ago. Mr. Galloway asked was there any rational as to why the CAC member was removed from the Policy Committee. Mr. Hull stated that one factor was that the chair of

the CAC did not attend the PC meetings as they should. Mr. Skrine asked Mr. Hull his thoughts concerning this? Mr. Hull responded that it made no difference to him either way as the decision is up to the committees. He continued that the individual should make meaningful contribution to the discussions on the PC. Mr. Branham stated that there needs to be some representation from the citizens perspective. Mr. Skrine stated that not just the chair but maybe the chair or his/her appointee. Mr. Hull stated that those options could be discussed with the PC. Ms. McConico made a motion; Mr. McLane made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

#### E. (PC) Metropolitan Statistical Area Discussion

Mr. Hull explained to the committee that on Jan 2019, the Office of Management and Budget decided to change the definition of what qualifies as a Metropolitan Statistical Area. Currently an Urban Area that is a population of 50,000 or more is a MSA, now they are proposing to get rid of that definition. There are six MSA's in Ga including Valdosta. Their new definition will include a threshold of 100,000 persons. The Valdosta Urbanized Area will still not reach 100,000 persons after the 2020 census. Mr. Hull stated that at this time it does not impact transportation in any way. On February 9th the U.S. Census Bureau changed the definition of an Urban Area from 50,000 to 10,000. So this is changing what is defined as an urban area and further complicates this. Mr. Galloway stated that there were some programs that came as a result of being designated as a Metropolitan area. Ms. Flucas stated that they are checking into whether or not this will have any impacts on their ability to obtain their Community Block Grant Development Funding. She continued that the funding that was being received under urban could potentially be compromised. Ms. Hobdy asked if the transit would be impacted. Mr. Hull stated that under the federal legislation for these programs neither one of them appear to reference urban or metropolitan statistical area. Mr. Hull stated that both congressman and senators have been invited to a meeting.

#### F. Bicycle / Pedestrian Infrastructure Discussion

Mr. Hull asked the committee what should we be planning for in the areas of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. Mr. Galloway stated that with the push towards reducing the dependence on fossil fuels ma drive a shift on how people get around. Having this infrastructure in place also seems to keep a lot of the vounger people around and we would like to keep them in our community too. Ms. Hodges stated that there are many areas with apartments that do not have sidewalks and many people are walking in the road, such as Connell Road. People in wheelchairs are doing this as well. Mr. Worley stated that every road should be planned to include multimodal trails. Mr. Galloway asked if there was funding available for a new plan. Mr. Hull stated that there is some discretionary funding that we could apply for and some transit funding that may be available. Mr. Hubbard stated that a portion of the federal gas tax is set aside for bike trails but I don't know what you have to do to get the funding. Mr. Milligan stated that he would be interested to see how much of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan has been accomplished in the last 14 years. Mr. Hull thanked everyone for their comments.

#### A. Strategic Plan Update

Mr. Hull stated that some of the items in the strategic plan have been accomplished and that staff is continuing to incorporate items from the plan.

#### B. Staffing Changes / Updates

Mr. Hull notified the committee that Ariel Godwin is no longer working with the SGRC and has taken a Planner Position for Moody AFB. He continued that the RC will also be hiring a consultant to complete at request various tasks for Transportation Department.

Agenda Item #6 – Privilege of the Floor/Public Comment

Mr. Hull stated that earmarks are back after 14 years and that members should be thinking about what projects they may want to see completed.

Ms. Tooley notified the committee that the South Troup Street improvements with sidewalks and bike lanes has been a bug improvement to the community and many people are using them. Mr. Milligan also stated that there are four sidewalk projects that will begin construction soon. Mr. Branham stated that USDA and HUD has implemented some new programs and that staff should look into it.

Mr. Fletcher called the meeting to order at 9:01 AM.

Agenda Item #2 – Introductions/Roll Call

A. Review Committee Attendance (all committees)

Mr. Fletcher asked those present to introduce themselves and state their affiliation with the committee.

Agenda Item #3 – Approval of Regular Meeting Minutes

Mr. Fletcher asked the committee members to review the December 2, 2020 meeting minutes. Mr. Collins made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

Agenda Item #4– New Business

A. (PC) Nominating Committee Does Not Apply to the TAC.

B. FY2021 Unified Planning Work Program Amendment Resolution FY21-4 Action: Recommendation/Adopt

Mr. Hull notified the committee that the FY2021 UPWP was being amended due to additional funding received from GDOT in the amount of two dollars, the updated amounts can be seen in red on the summary sheet. He stated that those changes are at the request of the GDOT Transit Division. This amended was completed to be sure that everything matches from the UPWP to the contract. He continued in order to update the funding amounts an amendment must be completed with a motion and vote from the TAC to recommend it to the policy committee. Ms. Fletcher made a motion to recommend the UPWP for approval, Mr. Collins made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

C. FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program Adoption Resolution FY21-5 Ms. Martin notified the committee that the FY2022 UPWP had been completed and that staff did not receive any major comments from our planning partners. Ms. Martin reviewed the UPWP Budget Summary for the committee and explained that in order for the UPWP to be adopted that there needs to be a motion and a vote for the document to be recommended to the PC. Mr. Fletcher asked was the City of Valdosta going forward with transit. Ms. Martin responded that they are and Corey can provide more information about that. Mr. Hull stated that yes the City is moving forward are and they have asked for \$96,000 in federal funds, \$12,000 in state funds and \$12,000 in funds from the City of Valdosta for future planning of the Transit System. Mr. Collins stated that he does not know all the details because he is not directly involved in it but they had expected an earlier start date but it took a while to get the approval of the title. Mr. Collins made a motion to approve the resolution. Mr. Fletcher made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

D. Participation Plan Update Adoption Resolution FY21-6 Mr. Hull notified the committee that the Public Participation Plan had been out for public comment for the last 45 days. He continued that the comments that were received were minor and did not change the content of the document. Mr. Hull stated that Ms. Flucas stated that there are not supposed to be any impacts to the CBDG programs but she has yet to see that documented. Mr. Fletcher asked how would this affect the MPO status. Mr. Hull responded that there should be no change whatsoever, that the MPO does not use MSA status as its defining criteria.

#### F. Bicycle / Pedestrian Infrastructure Discussion

Mr. Hull asked the committee what should we be planning for in the areas of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. He continued do you think we need to be updating our bicycle planning documents. Mr. Fletcher stated that the County Commissioner has made it a priority to consider and install where appropriate bicycle lanes and sidewalks. Mr. Worley stated that the Tifton Bicycle Plan would be a good example for Valdosta to follow. He continued that incorporating bike/ped infrastructure from the beginning would be most beneficial and it would help to pass ordinances or policies that would help to accomplish this. Mr. Collins stated that the City of Valdosta has very narrow right of way, Jerry Jones for example, which we ended up going with easements. This really makes it expensive to put in bicycle lanes but a I am a big fan of them. The Azalea Trail was supposed to be extended through Remerton and maybe you all can help us with that. Also perhaps along the county roadways we could put some trails along those roads. One of the things that I asked, and they were unable to answer it, was identifying GA Power corridors, railroad corridors, various different corridors that would be available to put a trail. Mr. Worley responded that maybe changing a sidewalk that is already in place, on Baytree for example, and making that a part of the trail.

Mr. Hull stated that some of the items in the strategic plan have been accomplished and that staff is continuing to incorporate items from the plan.

Mr. Barber called the meeting to order at 10:30 AM.

#### Agenda Item #2 – Introductions/Roll Call

#### A. Review Committee Attendance (all committees)

Mr. Barber asked those present to introduce themselves and state their affiliation with the committee.

#### Agenda Item #3 – Approval of Regular Meeting Minutes

Mr. Barber asked the committee members to review the December 2, 2021 meeting minutes. Mr. Barber asked if there were any comments, additions, or deletions to the minutes. There were none; the minutes were approved by acclamation.

#### **Agenda Item #4– New Business**

#### A. (PC) Nominating Committee

Mr. Barber stated that it is the time of year for the P to set up a nominating committee that will choose a member from the Policy Committee to be the chair of the committee. Mr. Barber asked Ms. Cribb, Mr. Matheson, and Mr. Cain to serve on the committee. The members agreed to serve on the committee.

### B. FY2021 Unified Planning Work Program Amendment Resolution FY21-4 Action: Recommendation/Adopt

Mr. Hull notified the committee that the FY2021 UPWP was being amended due to additional funding received from GDOT in the amount of two dollars, the updated amounts can be seen in red on the summary sheet. He stated that those changes are at the request of the GDOT Transit Division. This amendment was completed to be sure that everything matches from the UPWP to the contract. He continued that both the CAC and TAC approved the amendment without any discussion. Mr. Slaughter made a motion to approve the amendment. Ms. Cribb made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

#### C. FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program Adoption Resolution FY21-5

Ms. Martin notified the committee that the FY2022 UPWP had been completed and that staff did not receive any major comments from our planning partners. Ms. Martin reviewed the UPWP Budget Summary for the committee and explained that in order for the UPWP to be adopted that there needs to be a motion and a vote. Mr. Matheson made a motion to approve the resolution. Ms. Dukes made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

#### D. Participation Plan Update Adoption Resolution FY21-6

Mr. Hull notified the committee that the Public Participation Plan had been out for public comment for the last 45 days. He continued that the comments that were received were minor and did not change the

content of the document. He stated that one comment did not really impact the document but was a request from Mr. Branham, a member on the CAC, to request for the chair of the CAC to have a seat as a voting member on the Policy Committee (PC). Mr. Hull gave some background on how the CAC chair previously had a seat in the PC years prior before the PC updated their bylaws. Mr. Hull stated that the CAC did pass the resolution with the request that the TAC consider this recommendation. Mr. Barber asked was the request reflected in the resolution. Mr. Hull stated that it was not reflected in the resolution but that it is reflected in the comment and response section of the document. Mr. Slaughter asked would that need to be addressed on a separate agenda item. Mr. Hull stated that it would be a further discussion because the bylaws would need to be updated. Mr. Barber stated that we will add this as a line item to the next agenda. Mr. Matheson made a

motion to adopt the plan. Mr. Cain made a motion in the second. The vote was unanimous; the motion carried.

#### E. (PC) Metropolitan Statistical Area Discussion

Mr. Hull explained to the committee that on Jan 2019, the Office of Management and Budget decided to change the definition of what qualifies as a Metropolitan Statistical Area. Currently an Urban Area that is a population of 50,000 or more is a MSA, now they are proposing to get rid of that definition. There are six MSA's in Ga including Valdosta. Their new definition will include a threshold of 100,000 persons. The Valdosta Urbanized Area will still not reach 100,000 persons after the 2020 census, I anticipate that happening around the 2030 census. Mr. Hull stated that at this time it does not impact transportation in any way. On February 19<sup>th</sup> the U.S. Census Bureau released a definition of an Urban Area from 50,000 to 10,000. Mr. Hull stated that there may be some impacts that he is not so sure of in the areas of CBDG funding for the City of Valdosta, and Medicare/Medicaid funding due to the MSA change. Mr. Hull stated that he has prepared an outline of a letter if needed. Mr. Barber stated that he did receive confirmation that this would not affect the city's CDBG funding.

#### F. Bicycle / Pedestrian Infrastructure Discussion

Mr. Hull reviewed various resources that the SGRC has as it relates to bicycle and pedestrian planning. He cited the Complete Streets Plan and Aging in Place Toolkit. He stated that the Lowndes Valdosta Parks and Recreation department are currently creating their master plan. Mr. Hull asked the committee what are their thoughts concerning bike and ped planning in the community. Mr. Barber asked what discussions did the CAC and TAC have concerning this. Md. Hull responded that during the CAC, they wanted to know how many projects had been completed from the Valdosta-Lowndes Bike and Ped Master Plan. He continued that the TAC mentioned that the county has come to an agreement that bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure should be considered with new developments. Also, that the Tifton Plan is a good resource for implementation. He continued that Ms. Tooley also stated the increase of people walking and biking on Troup Street after its installment of bicycle lanes and sidewalks. Mr. Matheson stated that the City is currently working on connecting sidewalks within the community. Mr. Barber also stated that one thing they want to consider for subdivisions is a green space. Ms. Cody asked if Lowndes County was still looking at working with the City on extending the sidewalks on Forrest Street from Inner Perimeter to Bemiss Road. Mr. Slaughter responded yes, that would be the direction that we would be working towards.

#### Agenda Item #5- Staff Update

#### A. Strategic Plan Update

Mr. Hull stated that some of the items in the strategic plan have been accomplished and that staff is on target to continue completing the recommendations in the plan.

#### **B. Staffing Changes / Updates**

Mr. Hull notified the committee that Ariel Godwin is no longer working with the SGRC and has taken a Planner Position for Moody AFB. He continued that the RC will also be hiring a consultant to complete, at request, various tasks for the Transportation Department.

#### Agenda Item #6 - Privilege of the Floor/Public Comment

There were no comments.

#### Agenda Item #7 - Next Meeting Date and Time

The next meeting will be Wednesday, June 2, 2021 at 10:30 AM at the New SGRC office.

Project Description: Designed as a four-lane roadway with a grass median and will more efficiently serve freight generating facilities south of downtown through geometric improvements such as improved turning radii, stopping distances, and turning lanes. The proposed project utilizing the eastern segment of Gil Harbin Industrial Boulevard will include intersection design improvements and require additional ROW on the north side of the existing roadway. The segment between Madison Highway and South Patterson Street will also require widening to the four-lane typical section. Flyover ramps are also being proposed to provide more efficient access to the new bypass by avoiding railroad crossings. The proposed project would utilize existing roadway ROW along Tucker Road. Residential areas between Griffin Avenue and South Patterson Street will require additional consideration, as the properties are needed to connect the proposed alignment to existing Howell Road to US 41/Inner Perimeter Road. The final segment of the alignment follows Inner Perimeter Road north to US 84. Many of the Southern Bypass existing two-lane alignments that are utilized will need to be widened. These roads include Howell Road, Tucker Road, and Lloyd Jackson Road.

Purpose & Need:

In a Valdosta MPO-sponsored study completed in 2009, local stakeholders identified safety, noise, air quality, operating, and economic concerns of trucks traveling in close proximity to passenger vehicles and pedestrians on the US 84 one-way-pairs through downtown Valdosta. The goal of this project is to re-designate the section of US 84 through downtown as a non-NHS route, such that local government could enact truck restrictions as they wish.



The City of Hahira is facing transportation challenges in two primary areas, the area around North Lowndes Park and the area around the Hahira Elementary School.

North Lowndes Park is undergoing a multi-phase expansion that includes 8 soccer fields and 8 softball fields in additional to other existing park amenities. This expansion has the opportunity to bring as many as 10,000 visitors per weekend to the park for travel league soccer and softball tournaments. This additional traffic will cause a strain on existing access roads as surrounding land is expected to develop to meet the needs of the audience attending events at the park. The surrounding land uses are anticipated to develop into restaurants, hotels, retail businesses, multi-family housing.

The City of Hahira seeks innovative solutions to provide additional transportation access to North Lowndes Park as well as an evaluation of existing land uses and recommendations for land use optimization for the area immediately south of North Lowndes Park and around I-75 Exit 29.

As the area population has grown, so to has the number of parents' dropping of their children at the Elementary School causing challenges with blocking streets in the surrounding neighborhoods.

The City of Hahira seeks innovative solutions to provide relief to congestion and safety issues caused by parent drop-offs by evaluating additional transportation access to the eastside of Hahira Elementary School as well as an evaluation of existing land uses and recommendations for land use optimization for the area immediately surrounding the Elementary School as additional residential development pressures are anticipated.
